Federal law requires the billing of services for preventive care and problem visits separately.

Preventative Services include but may not be limited to the following:

- Conducting an exam based on your age and gender.
- Providing advice about staying healthy and healthy living choices.
- Identifying risk factors.
- Screening tests based on age, gender, or lifestyle.
- Keeping your immunizations up to date relative to OB care.

Annual preventive/wellness visits are covered by many health insurance plans, potentially with no out-of-pocket costs to you.

Problem Visit includes but may not be limited to the following:

- Discussion of any new or existing health problem, illness, or injury.
- Management of chronic, ongoing health problems and/or medications.
- Extended education about preconception counseling, birth control counseling, cervical screening abnormalities or other concerns requiring an extended discussion.

Preventative Services and Problem Visits are considered as a separate single office visit, even if done at the same appointment, by your health insurance company which could result in you receiving a bill for these services. Your insurance provider may pass some or all the costs on to you.
